1. 02:00:00 WS - Aerial Shot of the First Early Man Site discovered in 1978 in the Arctic. The site is a world class Paleo Indian find in Alaska and the Arctic Circle. The Mesa site was a hunting look out and is located in the Keriak Valley, 150 miles north of the Arctic Circle, 400 miles north of Fairbanks, and 200 miles south of Point Barrow Alaska.
