Subject: Reporting FY 2003 Procurement Data on Wildland Fire Program Actions

The purpose of this memorandum is to establish a requirement to report all wildland fire program contracting actions exceeding \$2,500 using the SF-279 reporting format.

We issued revised reporting codes for the wildland fire program in an e-mail from Wiley Horsley of my staff on December 10, 2002 (copy attached). That release was the result of an effort to meet the data needs of the National Fire Plan Operations and Readiness System (NFPORS) and to simplify the reporting requirements, while collaborating as much as possible with the USDA Forest Service for purposes of uniform data availability and consistent reporting to Congress.

We explored, over a period of several months, the potential of collecting data from the Federal Financial System (FFS), including using modified budget object classes. We also considered programming IDEAS to search the accounting data stream in incoming requisitions for the codes used by the four land management bureaus for wildland fire program actions and converting those codes into the agreed reporting categories. No two bureaus use the same codes. The complexity, time and resources required to do the necessary programming made the effort unwise for the short term. We are, nevertheless, following the progress of an inter-bureau team that is trying to standardize the accounting codes. We may be able to take this approach in FY 2004, to reduce the reporting burden on the procurement workforce while increasing the accuracy of the final data.

In the past we have encouraged the bureaus to use SF-279 level (detailed) reporting on all wildland fire program actions as low as \$500 in order to get the maximum data and contracting credit. After consulting with selected bureau managers, we are establishing a \$2,500 reporting threshold. Bureaus who cannot comply with this requirement may request a waiver by written submission to me, outlining the burden involved and the plan to resolve the current impediments.

The Office of Aircraft Services is able to collect and separately submit wildland fire award data from existing codes on their flight report, OAS Form 23. This approach will

be allowed for FY 2003, but integral reporting through IDEAS PD must be implemented for FY 2004.

Subject: Re: Request for Accounting Subactivities - NFP Contracts Reporting Requirements

(FAX to David Brown and Terry Moen of BIA Procurement)

After discussions with USDA Forest Service and the NFPORS Project Manager at the recent Denver fuels conference, we surveyed the bureaus with a proposal to simplify the FY 2003 procurement data reporting codes for fireplan contracting. We received only one comment, which was from BLM. That comment suggested that we drop plans to collect award codes for preparedness and suppression. The suggestion was based, in part, on BLM's ability to identify such awards separately through their management information system. Other bureaus do not have as sophisticated an MIS. After consulting with Tim Hartzell on projected and, in fact, recently expressed information needs of the Congress, we elected to keep those categories in the mix and also elected to break out burned area stabilization from rehabilitation. The resulting six codes are:

PRE	Preparedness
SUP	Suppression
WFT	WUI fuels treatments
NFT	Non-WUI fuels treatments
STA	Burned area emergency stabilization
REH	Burned area rehabilitation

The appropriate code for each fireplan procurement must be entered into the reserved block 48 of the SF-279 equivalent in the Interior Department Electronic Acquisition System (IDEAS PD) as each procurement for fireplan goods or services is awarded and reported into the Interior Procurement Data System (IPDS).

We delayed finalizing these codes and the reporting approach, in part, to get a better understanding of the work going on with standardizing the related accounting line segments in FFS across the fireplan bureaus. That effort will not yield results in FY 2003 to allow full year reporting but we will follow the effort for possible application in FY 2004. It may permit more detailed and easier reporting. For the interim, contracting officers are to work with their fire management officers, hazardous fuels specialists or other fireplan requisitioners to ensure that the proper code is used for each award through IDEAS PD into IPDS.
