FOOTNOTES

This column includes new actions during the fiscal year as shown in the three right-hand columns of this table. New actions show the number of leases, licenses, and permits authorized and logical mining units approved with effective dates during the fiscal year. Pending preference right lease applications are shown. These include preference right lease applications that may have been rejected by the Bureau of Land Management but that are, or were, under appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals.

/b/ FCLAA is the Federal Coal Leasing Amendments Act. This case type includes competitive and noncompetitive coal leases issued prior to August 4, 1976.

/c/ Includes two leases created by segregating lands from existing competitive pre-FCLAA leases. The two leases retain the effective dates and other characteristics of the existing leases from which they were created.

/d/ Includes two leases created by segregating lands from existing competitive regional leases. The two leases retain the effective dates and other characteristics of the existing leases from which they were created.

/e/ Includes one lease created by segregating lands from an existing preference right lease. The lease retains the effective dates and other characteristics of the existing lease from which it was created.
