The BLM National Training Center is requesting nominations for Archaeological Law Enforcement, Course 8100-26, in Ridgecrest, California, July 23-25, 2002. The course is designed for Law Enforcement Officers and Cultural Resource Specialists in California. Nominations from Oregon, Nevada and Arizona will be accepted as space permits.

The Archaeological Law Enforcement course provides training on all aspects of the investigation and prosecution of archaeological crimes. An archaeological crime scene practical exercise also included in the class. Participants will be required to carry out crime scene investigation and field damage assessment procedures at a mock archaeological crime scene. A full course description is available on the NTC website (see below).

This course is the basic ARPA course offered by Archaeological Resource Investigations through the BLM National Training Center. The course will start at 8:00 a.m. July 23, 2002, and end at 5:00 p.m. July 25, 2002.
