



Your Tax Dollars and the Public Lands

The BLM, an agency of the Department of the Interior, manages 264 million acres of mostly Western land and 700 million acres of subsurface mineral estate nationwide. The BLM manages these lands for multiple use and on a sustained-yield basis to meet the "present and future needs of the American people." Public lands, which extend across rangelands, forests, high mountains, arctic tundra, and deserts, yield important economic benefits that make the BLM an asset to the American taxpayer.

Of all the Federal agencies, the BLM is the fourth-largest generator or receipts:

Internal Revenue Service (FY 1999)	\$1 trillion
Customs (FY 1999)	\$14 billion
Minerals Management Service (FY 1999)	\$4.6 billion
Bureau of Land Management	\$2.2 billion

The BLM raises more money than it spends:

Treasury receipts generated by the BLM	\$2.2 billion
BLM annual budget (including permanent appropriations)	\$2.0 billion
Net gain to the U.S. Treasury	\$200 million

BLM-generated receipts are derived from activities that take place on the public lands, including mineral leasing, grazing, rights-of-way across public lands, and recreation.
