## **Temporary Closure of Tioga Trail Segment Begins July 20**

A 2.5 mile section on the Tioga Segment of the North Umpqua Trail will be closed to all traffic effective July 20<sup>th</sup> for reconstruction of this section of trail. From Swiftwater Trailhead, the closure area is where the trail hits BLM Road 26-2-21.0 (approximately 7 miles up) to the Nezcic Creek Bridge, which is across the river from Susan Creek Campground. Construction is expected to last for one month. For further information, please contact the Roseburg District BLM at (541) 464-3271.
