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Hazard Tree Removal at Alsea Falls Recreation Site

Salem, Ore – The U.S. Bureau of Land Management, Marys Peak Resource Area, will be removing hazard trees at Alsea Falls Recreation Site between January 20th and April 30th as part of the South Fork Alsea Access Road Hazard Tree Removal/Roadside Enhancement and Alsea Falls Park Enhancement Project. The Alsea Falls Recreation Site is located 27 miles southwest of Corvallis and 13 miles west of Monroe, Oregon on the banks of the south fork of the Alsea River.

Approximately 11 trees have been identified within the campground area as hazards to public safety. These trees will be cut and removed to protect public safety and infrastructure. The project is anticipated to take less than a week and will be completed before the park opens for public use this spring.
