

**PAC Subcommittee Meeting**  
**September 17, 2003**  
**Siuslaw National Forest Headquarters**  
**9 a.m. – 12 p.m.**

The PAC subcommittee will come to the entire PAC on October 23 with the following recommendations:

- 1) Coast PAC supports the Stewardship Authority to be used on BLM and Forest Service managed lands.
- 2) Coast PAC would like to see a new Stewardship project initiated with the next year on BLM or Forest Service managed lands.
- 3) Coast PAC would like to advise the District Manager and Forest Supervisor on Stewardship guidelines. PAC may want to write a letter to the State Director or Regional Forester asking that no further restrictions be imposed on a regional level than what is proposed in the national stewardship guidelines.

The PAC subcommittee will be looking for agreement from the Coast PAC.

Other suggestions made during the meeting include:

Recommend that some flexibility be given to the Siuslaw Stewardship pilot. On this note, the subcommittee will meet with Johnny Sundstrom and Bob Turner October 20 to discuss ways the Coast PAC may be able to help the pilot.

Socio-economic – Per Ron Philips request, the Forest Service and BLM will provide a list of thinning sales projected for the near future.

OHV – Ron Phillips asked for a review of off-highway vehicle riding areas in the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area in the hopes of increasing riding areas. There was discussion about the necessity to amend the Dunes Management Plan in order to accommodate this request.

Amendment to OHV paragraph – Ron Phillips would like discussion about trails for horse, hiking and OHV. He referenced work being done on the Corvallis to Coast trail. How big of a project would it be to rough out trails (hikers and horses), Corvallis to the Coast, and Eugene to the Coast. How big of a project would it be to pull this together?
