Daniel Slosberg living history performances featured in Leo Adler Theater

Baker City, Oregon- Popular living history interpreter Daniel Slosberg will bring his historical characters to The National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center June 12-15.

Slosberg presents a program about Pierre Cruzatte - a French-Canadian frontiersman, boatman, and fiddler on the Lewis and Clark Expedition - playing original fiddle tunes from the era and sharing stories from the great overland adventure.

He also will present a brand new program about how the “Star Spangled Banner” came to be our National Anthem, titled “Banners and Beans”.

Slosberg is from Los Angeles, and annually tours the west during summer months to present his programs at historic sites. His thorough research on the topics is evident in the costuming, props, music and facts he uses in his presentations. His high energy programs include audience participation, especially geared toward younger audiences, although his fact filled presentations are enjoyed by all ages.

Slosberg’s presentations are scheduled for 11:00 am, 1:00 and 3:00 pm each day indoors in the Leo Adler Theater.

The National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, operated by the Bureau of Land Management, is located 5 miles east of Baker City, Oregon on Highway 86. Take Exit 302 from I-84. The Center is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. Admission for adults is \$8. Seniors are \$4.50. Children 15 and under are free. Federal passes are accepted.
