

Dear Sir:

This is my "Public Comment". I believe that the forest lands, managed by the BLM, should be harvested up to a level that is 10% below the level of sustainability. This would allow for a 10% increase in our forested lands, at the same time that they are generating a maximum income for the public benefit. BLM's "Alternative 2", does not seem to go far enough in that direction, but is a good first step.

I would suggest that "Clear Cutting" be avoided, where and when ever possible, to promote staggered re-growth of the harvested areas, and for aesthetic reasons. This might also reduce (how ever slightly) the "Environmentalists" opposition.

I am well aware that the "Environmentalists" will oppose any harvesting of timber, as they have in the past. This is to be expected, and I would request that the BLM use every resource to fight them on this issue. It is my belief that the ultimate goal of the "Environmentalists" is to force every human being to revert to cave dwelling, and living on seeds, nuts and berries (hunting would not be allowed).
