Erik Sandgren will offer a three-day painting and drawing workshop on site at Yaquina Head for serious learners at all levels of experience. Participants will work from observation in the unique historical and natural environment of this area of outstanding natural beauty. Drawing and painting directly from this special landscape with demonstrations and discussions will emphasize developing expressive composition through stages of sketching, observation, and revision. Special focus will be on drawing as a means of developing scale, pictorial space, and expressive use of color.

Instruction will be individualized as much as possible within the framework of the workshop. Each session limited to 15 participants. A minimum of five students must be registered and fully paid by July 15 for the class to run.

Registration: \$125 for three sessions, or \$225 for six (all) sessions
Make checks payable to "Friends of Yaquina Lights"

Handicap Access: Site is accessible; beach and lighthouse interior are not. Morning sessions will take place at the beach - during lower tides. Afternoon sessions will take place from the bluff above the beach, near the lighthouse. Participants with physical limitations should register for afternoon sessions. Restrooms at Interpretive Center and outhouses near lighthouse are accessible. Workshop will take place outdoors regardless of the weather – rain, wind, or sun. Participants should dress to be outdoors for extended periods of time. Weather is often cool, and strong breezes are common. Indoor space is available as needed for discussion and critique. Yaquina Head is open from sunrise to sunset. The site's day use fee is included in workshop participants' registration.
