Dear Dr. Mock:

Reference is made to your request (File No. SPL-2010-00382), on behalf of Tessera Calico Solar, for clarification on whether a Department of the Army Permit is required for the Tessera Calico Solar Project (formerly Solar One and Three), near Pisgah, San Bernardino County, California. The proposed site is contained entirely in a closed basin, ultimately draining to Troy Dry Lake.

Based on the approved jurisdictional determination dated May 4, 2010, we have determined the Tessera Calico Solar Project site does not contain waters of the United States pursuant to 33 C.F.R. §325.9. As such, a Department of the Army Permit will not be required to construct and operate the proposed project. This does not eliminate the need for any other federal, state, or local permitting, as applicable.
