

**Notice of Decision**  
USDI - BLM  
Columbine Field Office and  
Gunnison Field Office  
Hinsdale and San Juan Counties, Colorado

On September 30, 2010, Columbine Field Office Manager Matt Janowiak and Gunnison Field Office Manager Brian St. George approved the *Alpine Triangle Recreation Area Management Plan* (RAMP). The RAMP provides comprehensive guidance and direction toward providing sustainable recreation activities, and maintaining or improving the condition of unique cultural and natural resources while creating an environment to promote the health and safety of visitors, employees, and neighboring residents.

Within 30 days of publication of this decision, any person whose interest is adversely affected by a final decision of the authorized officers may appeal the decision for the purpose of a hearing before an administrative law judge, at the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, in accordance with the regulations at 43CFR 4.400.

The appeal shall state clearly and concisely the reason(s) why the appellant thinks the final decision of the authorized officer is wrong. An appellant also may petition for a stay of the final decision pending appeal by filing a petition for stay along with the appeal within 30 days after the publication of the decision.

*Appeal and stay procedures, and addresses for filing are outlined on BLM form CO-050-1840-191, available upon request (included in the Decision Record).*

Pursuant to 43 CFR 4.21, if no appeal is filed within the 30 day time period, implementation of this decision may occur immediately at the close of the appeal-filing period. If an appeal is received along with a request for stay of decision, the decision does not go into effect for an addition 45 days, or until the Office of Hearings and Appeals denies the petition, whichever is first.

Communications received in response to this notice, including personal identifying information, will be considered part of the public record for this proposed action and will be available for public inspection.
