

Dominguez-Escalante NCA Advisory Council Background Information Nomination Form

The Dominguez-Escalante National Conservation Area includes 209,610 acres of BLM-administered public lands designated as a National Conservation Area through the Omnibus Public Lands Act of 2009 (Public Law 111-11). It also includes the approximately 66,280 acres designated as the Dominguez Canyon Wilderness.

These lands are to be managed to conserve and protect the unique and important resources and values of the land, including the geological, cultural, archaeological, paleontological, natural, scientific, recreational, wilderness, wildlife, riparian, historical, educational, and scenic resources of the public land, and the water resources of area streams.

We are looking for and will give preference to applicants that live in Delta, Montrose, or Mesa Counties.

If selected to serve as a member of this Advisory Council, you would be responsible for working with nine other members to provide recommendations and feedback to assist the Secretary of the Interior with the process of developing a Resource Management Plan, to determine how best to conserve and protect the area for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future generations.
