BLM reopens Cedar Mountain road northwest of Craig

CRAIG, Colo.— The Bureau of Land Management has reopened the upper portion of the Cedar Mountain road to motorized vehicles. The road, which is five miles northwest of Craig, Colo., was closed to motorized vehicles April 9 to protect nesting raptors.

The BLM's Cedar Mountain Management Plan allows for a seasonal closure of the road when necessary to reduce disturbance to nesting raptors and prevent nest abandonment.

“We appreciate the public's cooperation in observing this closure,” said BLM Little Snake Field Manager John Husband. “We are reopening the road to motorized vehicles now that the raptor nesting season is complete.”
