



Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Blue Creek Bay Public Tour and Workshop July 21, 2007

Welcome to the second of three planning workshops for the BLM-administered public lands at Blue Creek Bay. This is an opportunity to look at the area and discuss various features, issues and opportunities first-hand.

Goals:

- ✓ Familiarize the public with the property and some key locations
- ✓ Generate and record further discussion and comments
- ✓ Discuss range of options/limitations at various locations
- ✓ Determine primary public interests in recreation and conservation on the property

You will have the opportunity to visit any or all of the locations below. We will begin with a brief introduction and walking tour of the log landing area. You may then walk or drive to the upper bench meadow area. We will then travel to the wetland area on the west side of the bay and discuss wetland restoration and conservation. We will meet back at the log landing for a wrap-up.

There may be two additional stops, if there is interest and time, to see a segment of the Mullan Trail and to discuss potential use or development on the west side of the area.

Log landing (short walk through area)

Upper bench meadows (Drive to or hike up to/through meadow area)

Wetlands/west-side of property (drive to then short walk through meadow area)

Optional stops:

Trail system (vehicle tour, short walk)

Mullan Trail – involves hiking ½ mile (steep and brushy)
