

**The Weather:** Shoshone's winter temperatures range from about 17 degrees to 33 degrees, and summer temperatures range from about 56 to 91 degrees.

**Recreation:** Shoshone is located in Central Idaho at the junction of U.S. Highway 93, 26 and scenic State Highway 75. Just 23 miles north of Twin Falls and 75 miles to the famed Sun Valley Resort.

The town is a small, friendly rural area, where agriculture is the main economical base. Shoshone is a gateway leading to many natural wonders such as: Black Magic Canyon, Shoshone Ice Caves, Mammoth Caves, Craters of the Moon, Malad Gorge, 1000 Springs Scenic Route, Natural Hot Springs, Fossil Beds, City of Rocks, Balanced Rock, Oregon Trail, Shoshone Falls, Snake River Canyon and much more!

Most BLM Shoshone Field Office employees live in the Twin Falls area and make the short commute to the Shoshone office.

Shoshone is also close to the tourist mecca of Sun Valley and its famous ski resort, the scenic and touristy city of Ketchum, State Parks, museums, lakes, rivers and dams.
