

ERRATA SHEET-Farmington Field Office

The following technical correction in language has been made to the 2009 Farmington April EA; the change in language is highlighted in color. The modification in language (section 3.1.1 Air Quality) is to delete “proposed well is” and change to “proposed lease parcels are.”

3.1.1 Air Quality

Air quality in the area near the **proposed lease parcels are** generally good and is not located in any of the areas designated by the Environmental Protection Agency as “non-attainment areas” for any listed pollutants regulated by the Clean Air Act. During the summers of 2000 through 2002, ozone levels in San Juan County were approaching non-attainment. Additional modeling and monitoring was conducted by Alpine Geophysics, LLC and Environ International Corporations, Inc., in 2003 and 2004. Results of the modeling suggest the episodes recorded in 2000 through 2002 were attributable to regional transport and high natural biogenic source emissions. The model also predicted that the region will not violate the ozone NAAQS through 2007 and that the trends in the 8-hr ozone values in the region will be declining in the future. At the present time, the San Juan County is classified as in attainment with the revised federal ozone standard of 0.075 ppm. Rio Arriba County is unclassified because of there are no ozone monitors sited in Rio Arriba County
