- All wild burros available for adoption will be vaccinated, dewormed, and Coggins tested.
- Adoptions will be planned to coincide with the Bullfrog wild burro gather scheduled for March, 2012 in southern Nevada.
- Selection and number of wild burros available will be based on demand prior to the adoption. All wild horse and burro adoption requirements apply, including an approved adoption application.
- Due to the fluid nature of wild burro gathers, it is essential that potential adopters contact the Tonopah Field Office to express interest, submit applications and obtain important details as they become available.
- Date: March 7, 2012
