

## Stipulations for Harvest of Woodland Products (03/09)

---

**1 Cord of wood = 4 feet high x 4 feet wide x 8 feet long. A typical, full-size pick-up, bed level = ½ a cord.**  
**A Line post is 7 feet tall or less, and a Corner post is over 7 feet tall.**

---

1. **Firewood** and **Post Permits** are for **non-commercial** use only and **limited** to **Pinyon Pine** and **Juniper (Cedar)** trees.
2. Cutters will ensure they stay within the boundaries of the permit on **BLM administrated lands only**.
3. Woodland Permits are for designated roads only - **No off-road travel allowed**.
4. Only cut **dead standing and down trees** for **firewood**.
5. **Green (live) trees** may be cut **only for posts** and only if they are **30 inches or less** in diameter at chest height.
6. **No post cutting** is permitted **within 100 feet of a maintained road**.
7. All standing trees will be cut with remaining **stump heights of 10 inches or less**. **Lop and scatter** all slash.
8. **No cutting** is permitted on the **shores or banks of streams, rivers, lakes, ponds, or wetland** areas.
9. **No cutting** is permitted within **developed sites or areas** (e.g. camping areas, Recapture Reservoir, etc.)
10. **No cutting** is permitted within any designated **Wilderness Study Areas (WSA)**.
11. During periods when the ground appears **muddy** and when deep ruts result from vehicle passage, all vehicles will **stay on main roads** and not cause excessive soil erosion, rutting, and/or compaction.
12. Chainsaw shall have an **exhaust system in good repair** and a **spark arrester** consisting of a wire mesh screen.
13. Cutters will carry a **shovel** when operating a chainsaw for immediate use in the event of an accidental fire.
14. Cutters will attempt to **prevent and control any fires** which results from cutting activities. All fires will be reported to the BLM office as soon as possible.
15. Do not leave litter or trash - **pack it in, pack it out** (leave the area cleaner than you found it).
16. **Do not remove or disturb any cultural site and/or artifacts – such acts are prohibited by law.**
17. Do not cut, damage, or obliterate any survey marker or bearing tree.
18. Firewood and Post Permits are good for **1 year** and are **non-refundable**.
19. **Woodland Permit** and this **Stipulation page must be in possession** during harvest and transport.
20. The **tag** must be securely **attached to the load** and **clearly visible** before any wood is transported. **Validate tag by completely removing the month and day** from each tag for the date of the wood removal.

**Failure to properly validate and display tag or adhere to stipulations is a violation of federal law.**

The permittee and those accompanying him/her shall indemnify and hold the USDI BLM harmless from any claims, loss, cost, injury expenses, attorney's fees, damages, or liability caused by or arising out of the exercise of this permit.
