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Decision No: Conservation Measures Committed to by Bureau

CHANGE: Per IM-2007-020 new wording follows (changes underlined)

1. Add Conservation Recommendation (CR) 1 from IM WY-2007-020
 - a. CR1. In known occupied Ute ladies'-tresses orchid habitat, the service recommends that the Bureau use management actions that are compatible with protection and conservation of pollinators of the Ute ladies'-tresses orchid.
2. Add CR 2 from IM
 - a. CR2. The Service recommends that the Bureau monitor and manage invasive species so these do not impact the Ute ladies'-tresses orchid or its habitat.

DESCRIBE EXACT RATIONALE FOR THE CHANGE, TO INCLUDE REFERENCE MATERIAL (I.E., EA, RMP, IM, ETC).


REASON:

The conservation measures noted above will hereafter be utilized in all new land use and activity plan development (including revisions) and other resource management implementation actions (authorizations and projects) that involve activities that may impact species or habitats addressed in the conservation measures on BLM administered Public Lands in the Newcastle Field Office Planning area. These measures are based on current information and may be subject to change in the future based upon new information.

Consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is part of the planning process and incorporating conservation measures resulting from consultation are part of the planning process and compliance with the Endangered Species Act.

Subject: *Resource Management Plan (RMP) Maintenance Action*: Incorporation of the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Programmatic Biological Assessment (BA) for the Threatened Ute Ladies'-tresses Orchid (*Spiranthes diluvialis*) and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) Informal/Formal Consultation (Biological Opinion) into Field Office (FO) Resource Management Plans (RMPs) by Maintenance Action

The attached document transmits the FWS Biological Opinion (BO) and correspondence memorandum (informal and formal consultation) based on a review of potential activities and conservation measures described under all current Wyoming BLM RMPs (except the Snake River RMP) and the Wyoming statewide Programmatic Ute ladies'-tresses orchid BA, and the potential effects of these activities on the orchid in accordance with section 7 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA), as amended (16 U.S.C. 1531 et. seq. and 50 CFR §402.10). The FWS concurred with all of BLM's activity specific determinations of "no effect" or "not likely to adversely affect" presented in the revised Ute ladies'-tresses orchid Statewide Programmatic BA dated March 7, 2007. However, a "likely to adversely affect" determination was made for livestock grazing within all current RMPs and coalbed natural gas activities in the Buffalo and Platte River RMPs, resulting in formal consultation and a Biological Opinion (BO) from the FWS.

The Wyoming BLM Statewide Programmatic BA for the Ute ladies'-tresses orchid and the correspondence memorandum covering informal and formal consultation with the FWS can be found on the on the internet at www.blm.gov/wy/st/en/programs/Wildlife.html.

The preliminary determination is that this action is an RMP *Maintenance Action* as defined in 43 CFR 1610.5-4. All Wyoming BLM FOs should review their existing RMPs, the programmatic BA, and the FWS correspondence memorandum. If you agree with this determination, please maintain the official hard copy of your RMP within 30 days of the date of this Instruction Memorandum (IM). Please also maintain the web-based copy of your RMP during the same timeframe.
