AMENDED LOCATION NOTICE  
PINTO Lode Mining Claim.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This lode mining claim, the name of which is the PINTO and which contains rock in place bearing valuable mineral deposits, was originally entered upon and located on the 22nd day of December, 1896, by H. A. Sidow, John C. Clark, and George Bowen, who were then citizens of the United States; and the original location notice of this claim is recorded in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Gila, Territory of Arizona, in Book 6, of RECORDS OF MINES, at page 136. This amended location of said claim is made on this 29th day of May, 1909, by The Pinto Copper Mining Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, which corporation is the present owner of said claim, and said corporation hereby reserves and maintains all and abandons and relinquishes none of its rights in and to said mining claim.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and said corporation claims lengthwise of the claim 750 feet in a westerly direction and 750 feet in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), together with 300 feet in width of the surface ground on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the East to the West.

The claim is situated in the Globe Mining District, in the County of Gila, in the Territory of Arizona, about fifteen miles in a westerly direction from the City of Globe, Arizona, and it lies on the South side of Pinto Creek, about one-half mile below an old arrasta and cabin formerly owned and occupied by one Charles Banker.

The surface boundaries are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at a post and monument of stones at a point 750 feet westerly from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), said point of beginning being the center of the westerly end line of this claim; thence northerly 300 feet to a post and monument of stones, being the northwest corner of said claim; thence easterly 1500 feet to a post and monument of stones, being the northeast corner of said claim; thence southerly 300 feet to a post and monument of stones, being the center of the easterly end line of said claim; thence southerly 300 feet to a post and monument of stones, being the southeast corner of said claim; thence westerly 1500 feet to a post and monument of stones, being the southwest corner of said claim; thence northerly 300 feet to the place of beginning.
