TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Lookout Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by John Siess and G. Frank Harrington Citizens of the United States the undersigned, on the 12th day of August 1909

The length of this claim is 1300 feet, and we claim 1200 feet, in a Northerly direction and 100 feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the South west to the North east

The claim is situated and located in the Tiger Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 300 yds. in an easterly direction from Ora Belle quartz Mill.
