All lines were run directly on the ground, the locations of the corners being determined by traverses that closed within the allowable limits of error.

The ground embraced in the Slumbering Beauty Mill Site is non-mineral.

Corners Nos 1 & 2 of the Last Chance Lode were pulled in until the ^{lode} line south east of the discovery shaft, coincided with that called for in the location notice.

Notes of the establishment of U. S. M. M. No. 2736


