REPORT

A. Twichell, A Citizen of the United States. the undersigned, on the 1st day of May, 1901.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 1200 feet, in a North direction, and 300 feet in a South direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South

The claim is situated and located in the White Mesa Mining District, in Coconino County, in the Territory of Arizona, about- - - in a - - - direction from N. S. L. M. NO. And being bounded by the survey stakes established for said claim by A. W. Baker in April 1901 this amendment being made for the purpose of conformity with said survey
