This mining claim, the name of which is the Little Dick Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by J. A. Twichell for Pennsylvania Trust Co A Citizen of the United States the undersigned, on the 29th day of April 1901.

The length of this claim is 150 feet and I claim 750 feet, in a East direction and 750 feet in a West direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the West to the East.

The claim is situated and located in the White Mesa Mining District, in Coconino County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 1 mile in a Northwest direction from the N S. L. M. No. 1.
