This survey was made with a Buff & Buff Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Polaris observations. The distances were measured with 5 ft., 100 ft., and 500 ft. steel tapes.

The Cor. to Secs. 13, 14, 23 & 24, T. 4 S., R. 29 E. is a stone properly set and marked.

Sur. No. 1171, Colorado lode:

Cors. Nos. 11 & 12 both obliterated. I re-established Cor. No. 12 from points furnished by claimant of this lode and from notes of the original location of the Old Nick lode. The information from both these sources checked on the relocation of Cor. No. 12.

Lot No. 40, Yankee lode:

Cors. Nos. 2 and 4 obliterated. Cor. No. 3 a pine post in place identified by the owners of the Yankee lode as Cor. No. 3. Having no other data with which to establish the course of line 2-3, save the field notes, I

used the course as reported in the original field notes of Sur. No. 1127, Long fellow lode, Sur. No. 1171 Colorado lode reports Cor. No. 12 of that lode on line 3-4 Yankee lode. Cor. No. 3 Yankee lode being in place, I calculated the bearing of a line between Cor. 3 Yankee and Cor. 12 Colorado which would be the bearing of line 3-4 Yankee according to Sur. No. 1171.

Sur. No. 1127 N. Ex. Longfellow lode:

Cors. Nos. 13 and 16 are pine posts properly set and scribed. Cors. Nos. 14 and 15 have been obliterated. In making Sur. No. 2887, I had to re-run most of the lines of Sur. No. 1127 and among them line 13-16 of this lode. I found all these lines in error by six minutes, therefore, I have used the corrected bearing for the other three lines of this lode.

Sur. No. 2887 Martha and Utah lodes:

Cor. No. 3 of the Martha lode, and Cors. Nos. 2 and 3 of the Utah lode are pine posts properly set and scribed.

Sur. No. 1710, Medler and Famous lodes:

Cor. No. 2 Medler lode is a pine post properly set and scribed. Witness Cor. For Cors. Nos. 1 and 2 Medler and Famous lodes, respectively, is a pine post properly set and scribed.

The differences between these field notes and the location certificates or the returns of prior surveys, are due to errors in the latter.

The end center monuments of both the lodes embraced in this claim are mounds of stone.




