This shaft is centrally located with reference to a block of claims, 26 in number, at present owned by the applicants herein, and it is a recognized fact that the valuable mineral in this district tends to form deposits rather than veins, hence it is the custom here, for the most economical development of mines and the extraction of the ore, to work from a centrally located shaft and to run drifts from the various levels. This shaft tends to develop all the claims owned by the Bisbee Extension

It was found upon examining the location of the

Cochise County, Arizona, about 10 miles northerly from  
Bisbee.

The claims of this survey are more than 2 miles  
from any monument of the public survey or any United  
States Mineral Monument.

A monument known locally as Mc Coy's Mineral Monu-  
ment was taken as U. S. M. M. No. 2947. This is a  
4 x 4 inch post, 10 feet high, set in a monument of rocks  
6 feet high with a 7 foot base. This monument is situated  
at the north end of a long prominent hill, commands a  
great area and is easy of access.


