All corners of surveyed claims referred to in these notes are 4 x 4 posts properly scribed. This survey is tied to the nearest known corner of the public land

survey. I established the W.C.to Cor.No.2 Charleston at the closest point possible, in a safe and conspicuous place, upon a line of the survey continued. A suitable place could not have been had on line 1-2 or 2-3 within three times the distance.
