FIELD NOTES OF ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S. MINERAL MONUMENT NO. 3.

OWLS HEAD MINING DISTRICT, PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA.

Being under orders to make official surveys of the Cashier No.3 Mining Claim (Survey No.3080), and the Cashier Nos.1 & 2 Mining Claims (Survey No.3081), and finding same to be located on unsurveyed public land with no Section Corner or U.S. Mineral Monument within a radius of two miles, I proceeded to establish U.S. Mineral Monument No.3, Owls Head Mining District, as follows:-


