This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Luckey Strike Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by Old Camp M. & M. Co., the undersigned, on the 28, day of June, 1909.

The length of this claim is 1500, feet and we claim 1200 feet in a Northerly direction, and 300 feet in a Southerly direction, from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three Hundred (300) feet, in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said vein. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the northerly to the southerly.

The claim is situated and located in the Eureka Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 3 miles in a Easterly direction from Gray Back Mountain.


