This shaft has been sunk as a common improvement for the benefit of the two claims embraced in this survey and

for the Good Hope No.2, Good Hope No.3 and Good Hope No. 8 lodes, adjoining claims to the survey, which are owned by the claimants. The shaft at its present depth is well below the surface of each of the claims, and the proposed scheme of development is to continue sinking to a greater depth and by drifts and crosscuts from it develop and mine the ~~five~~ claims. The plan of using one advantageously located shaft for the development of a group of claims is one generally carried out in this district, and in this case being a feasible one, consistent with good mining, the value of the improvement is distributed equally between the claims, one fifth, or \$900.00 being distributed to each.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Berger Engineers transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

Report.

The side and end lines of the claims in this survey and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground. The north $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 2, Township 1 North, Range $15\frac{1}{2}$ East, G. & S.R.B. & M. to which ties are given, is a quartzite stone, 7 x 7 x 6 ins. out of the ground, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$ on the North face, with mound of stone alongside. Corner No.1 Fame Lode, Sur. 2919, to which tie is given, is a 4 x 4" post properly set and scribed. There is a nominal disagreement between the tie line from Corner No.1 of said Fame lode to the North $\frac{1}{4}$ corner, Sec.2, T.1 N., R.15 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., G. & S.R.B. & M. as approved and this tie as computed through the lines of this survey.

The disagreement between these notes and the location notices is due to errors in the latter.




