EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

I certify that the value of the labor and improvements made upon, or for the benefit of the location, by the claimant or his grantors, is not less than Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars, and that said improvements consist of

No. 1 The discovery shaft, which is on the Lode Line, at S. 43°59' E. 560 ft. from the center of line 1-2, 4-1/2 x 7 ft. 10 ft. deep, in altered andesite quartz and vein matter.

No. 2 A cut, the mouth of which bears from Corner No.1 S. 18° E. 790 ft. 4 ft. wide running S. 56° W. 11 ft. to a 7 ft. face, in vein matter and quartz.

Value \$55.00

No. 3 A cut, the mouth of which bears from Corner No.1 S. 25° 10' E. 465 ft. 4 ft. wide runs S. 4° E. 14 ft. to a 7 ft. face, in mineralized andesite and quartz.

Value \$70.00

No. 4 A cut, the mouth of which bears from Corner No.1 S. 22°45' E. 330 ft., 4 ft. wide, runs S. 8° W. 18 ft. to an 8 ft. face, in mineralized andesite and vein matter.

Value \$90.00

No.5 A shaft which bears from Corner No. 1 S. 31° E.

Feet 560 ft., 4 x 6 ft. 8 ft. deep, in andesite quartz and calcite.

Value \$64.00

No.6 1130 ft. of a side hill cut road, 10 ft. wide, 3 to 6 ft. high on upper side, in solid rock.

Value \$300.00

This road was built jointly by the claimant herein, and the Black Range Extension Mining Company, whose workings are some 2,000 ft. to the east and south of the Pinto lode.

The work was done in good faith, and for the manifest purpose of aiding in the conduct of mining operations on both the Pinto lode and the Black Range Extension property.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger Mining Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT

The lode line of this claim was run upon the ground and the corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

All ties were run upon the ground and the courses and distances found to be as herein stated.

U.S.I.M. 2512 is an andesite rock 16 x 17" set in a conical mound of stone 6 ft. at base and 5 ft. high, with a cross on top, and U.S.I.M. 2512 chiseled on the north face.

The S.E.Cor. Sec. 10 unapproved T.18 N., R. 20 W., G. & S. R. B. & M. is a 2 in. iron pipe with brass cap, properly set and marked.

Survey No. 2512, Golden Era lode. All corners are andesite rocks, properly set and marked.

I find the courses and distances of the boundary lines to be correct as approved.

I disagree very slightly with the connections to U.S.L.M. 2512, but the amount is too small to make note of, and I have checked over my work very completely.

NOTE:

The disagreement between these field notes and the Amended Location Certificate, is due to errors in the latter.
