Instrument

This survey was made with a Gurley solar transit. The courses were deflected from the meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

Report.

The lode line of this claim was run direct upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of off sets from the lode line. The tie line was run direct upon the ground.

While in the field I found that this claim is nearly two miles north and one half mile west of the N. W. Cor. of T. 9 N., R. 2 E.
