INSTRUMENT: Min. Sur. No. 3810 was made with a Berger transit. The course was deflected from a true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at its western elongation. The distance was measured with a 100 and 300 foot steel tape.

ADJOINING CLAIMS: Min. Sur. 3810 is bounded on the west by Min. Sur. No. 3789, on the north by the Sunset group, claimants on the east and south are unknown.

REPORT: The 20½ Mile corner of the White Mountain Indian Reservation is a 1 inch iron pipe with a brass cap marked ^{20½ M} PL WMIR AWB 1915 Lines 1-4, and 3-4 of Min. Sur. No. 3789 I find to be correct as approved. Cor. No. 3 of Mineral Survey 3789 is a X on a diabase ledge at top of cliff chiseled GV-3-3789.


