LOCATION:-

This survey is located on unsurveyed ground about 1/2 mile in a southerly direction from the mouth of Bone Head Canon on Salt River, approximately in sec. 4,, T.5N., R., 18E, Unsur, within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation .

INSTRUMENT:-

The survey was made with a Gurley transit. The

courses were deflected from a true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at its Lower Culmination.

^ The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.


ADJOINING CLAIMS:-

The survey is bounded on all sides by unappropriated ground of the Indian Reservation.

REPORT:-

U.S.L.M. No. 3849 has a Latitude of  $33^{\circ}46'$  and is a diabase outcrop in place,  $4.0' \times 2.0' \times 1.0'$  chiseled USLM-3849 with X for exact point with a conical mound of stone 6' foot base and 5 ft. high alongside. A quartzite boulder,  $4 \times 3 \times 1.5$  ft., chiseled BR-USLM 3849 with X for exact point bears  $S.50^{\circ}57'E. 90.83$  ft. A diabase outcrop,  $4' \times 2' \times 1'$ , chiseled BR-USLM 3849 with X for exact point bears  $S.14^{\circ}13'W. 13.20$  ft. A diabase boulder,  $3 \times 3 \times 1.5$  ft, chiseled BR-USLM-3849 with X for exact point bears  $S.56^{\circ}15'W. 13.35'$ . A diabase boulder  $2 \times 1.5 \times 1.2$  ft., chiseled BR-USLM-3849 with X for exact point bears  $N. 34^{\circ}33'E. 8.95$  ft. A round pointed butte bears  $N.29^{\circ}54'E$  approximately 2 miles. The low point in the Peninsula neck bears  $N.46^{\circ}38'W..$  The end of rocky point at Peninsula neck bears  $N.56^{\circ}38'W.$  The Mineral Monument is located about 3300 feet southerly from the mouth of Bone Head Canon on Salt River on the crest of a round flat topped diabase mound.






