This survey was made with a Universal Wild T-2 Theodolite No. T2-68064, reading by optical micrometer to one second of arc. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order.

All azimuths in this record were determined by the method of deflection angles referred to the meridian determined by the following observation:

November 10, 1962, at a point on line 1-4 this survey, in latitude $34^{\circ}02'$ N., and longitude $112^{\circ}09'$ W., I made a series of six horizontal angle measurements from Cor. No. 4 this survey to Polaris. Three measurements were taken with the instrument in both the direct and reverse positions, the time recorded at each pointing on Polaris. The true bearing of line 1-4 this survey is $N. 88^{\circ}38'40'' E.$

The lines were measured with a Lufkin steel tape 100 feet in length, graduated thruout to hundredths and tenths of a foot. The tape was compared with a standard tape at the time of survey and found to be correct.

All lines and connections of the survey were run by direct methods.

The magnetic declination observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of $14^{\circ}40'$ E.

Adverse proceedings were initiated against the claim on November 29, 1965, under Contest Number Arizona 034560. By Hearing Examiner's decision dated August 26, 1966, the Gold Star No. 3 lode claim was declared void. No appeal from the Hearing Examiner's decision was filed during the time allowed, and Contest Number Arizona 034560 was closed January 20, 1967.

Mineral Survey No. 4602 does not appear on any subsisting plats. Application A-1284 under the MCOA has been filed for a portion of the lands formerly embraced by the Gold Star No. 3 lode claim of M. S. #4602.
