My instrument having been tested and adjusted recently, and being in satisfactory adjustment, at 9h a.m. l.m.t., at the cor. point of secs. 7, 12, 13 & 18 on W. bdy. as recently established by me, I set off 22° 59' S. on the decl. arc and 34° 52½' N. on the lat. arc and determine a true mer. with the solar.

01.50 Leave Verde River, asc. abrupt.

1.85 Old road, brs. E. & W.

2.00 Witness cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 & 18 as already described in supplemental notes of subd. of this tp.

18.00 Top of high crag is 6 chs. E., thence along rough W. slope of same.

37.00 Canyon 80 lks. wide, course W. asc. abrupt.

40.00 Set a limestone 30x15x10 ins. 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ on W. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base 1 ½ ft. high W. of cor. from which, A cedar tree 6 ins. diam. brs. S. 45° W. 100 lks. dist. marked ¼ S. 12 B.T.

A palo-negro tree 4 ins. diam. brs. N. 85° E. 37 lks. dist marked ¼ S. 7 B.T.

Continue steep asc. along Rough W. slope.

80.00 For cor. point of secs. 1, 6, 7 & 12 I mark a cross on a sandstone ledge 12 ft. x 7 ft. x 5 ft. above ground with 5 grooves on S. and 1 groove on N. of cross and R. 2 E. on S.W. and T. 17 N.S. 7 on S.E. of cross, from which,

A cedar tree 6 ins. diam. brs. N. 62° E. 37 lks. dist. marked T. 17 N. R. 3 E. S. 6 B.T.

No other bearings, available. Pits impracticable.

On the ledge to W. of cor. I raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base 1 ½ ft. high.

Land mts. very rough.

Soil, 3rd & 4th rate, stony.

Timber, scattering cedar, mesquite.

Undergrowth, cedar, palo-negro, mesquite, cactus.

Mts. land exceptionally difficult to survey, 80.00 chs.

I find it impracticable to survey the line to the North bet. secs. 1 & 6 owing to the extremely steep, rocky, and almost impassable slope over which it passes, being the N.W. face of a bluff from 1,000 to 1,800 ft. facing to the North and West.
