Chains

Survey commenced Dec. 29, 1911, by Guy P. Harrington, U.S. Surveyor, and executed with a Young & Sons light mountain transit^{No. 8388} with solar attachment. The horizontal limb is provided with two double verniers placed opposite each other, reading to single minutes of arc, which is also the least count of the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

The instrument was examined and tested on the true meridian established at camp in Sec. 14, T. 9 N., R. 20 W., Arizona, on Dec. 6, 1911, and found to be in correct adjustment.

There are no subdivision lines in this township. The SE. cor. of this Tp. is in Lat. 34° 09' 30" N.; Long. 114° 16' 50" W. From the M.C. bet. secs. 31 and 36, 38.50 chs. North of the cor. of Tps. 9 and 10 N., Rgs. 19 and 20 W., I run with meanders along the left bank of the Colorado River, in Sec. 36.
