Chains

The "Baltimore" lode mining claim, Mineral Survey No. 2450, was surveyed in July 1907, by Ernest L. Robinson, U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, prior to the survey of the lines of the public land surveys in the vicinity, and he therefore established U.S.L.M. No. 2450 and tied said claim thereto. The "Baltimore" is the only claim of said mineral survey No. 2450.

In 1907 (September) Jesse B. Wright, U.S.D.S. surveyed the subdivision lines of T. 15 S., R. 22 E. and located the U.S.L.M. No. 2450 near the east end of the line bet. secs. 17 and 20 of said township. The mineral record tie from the "Baltimore" claim to this location of U.S.L.M. No. 2450 placed said claim on the line bet. secs. 18 and 19 of same T.

The said mining claim being reported by homestead entryman in sec. 24, T. 15 S., R. 21 E. as being located therein the following described survey of a tie between the claim and a public land corner was executed in order to segregate the mining claim from the non-mineral land.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, of T. 15 S., R. 21 E., established in May 1916, is an iron post, 1 in. in diam., projecting 18 ins. above ground, firmly set in ground and mound of stone, marked on brass cap

Intersect Cor. No. 3 of the "Baltimore" patented lode mining claim, Mineral Survey No. 2450, which is a pine post, 4 ins. square, projecting 3 ft. above ground, firmly set in ground and mound of stone, marked

NW C B on the SE. face, and
3 2450 on the NW. face.

This is the NW. corner of the "Baltimore" claim and as located by this tie the said claim lies entirely within the NE. quarter of section 24, T. 15 S., R. 21 E.

No other surveyed mining claims are located within this section at the present time.

The survey of the above described tie was executed on November 24, 1930, by Dupree R. Averill, U.S. Surveyor using a Buff and Buff transit No. 17992, described, with record of tests, in Book "E" of this group.

Measurement by Lallie steel tape, 5 chs. in length, compared with a Lufkin standard steel tape and found correct. The measurement was made on the slope, vertical angle determined with clinometer, and the slope measurement properly reduced to true horizontal equivalents for entry herein.


