RELATING TO THE COMMON BOUNDARY ON THE COLORADO RIVER BETWEEN THE STATES OF ARIZONA AND NEVADA, AND RATIFYING A COMPACT BETWEEN ARIZONA AND NEVADA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

Section 1. Ratification

The interstate compact defining a portion of the common boundary between the states of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado river between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the thirty-fifth degree of latitude north and Davis dam, which was executed on the sixth day of February, 1960, by the Colorado river boundary commissions of Arizona and Nevada, is hereby ratified and approved.

Sec. 2. Text of compact

The terms and provisions of the compact referred to in section 1 are as follows:

INTERSTATE COMPACT DEFINING A PORTION OF THE ARIZONA-NEVADA BOUNDARY ON THE COLORADO RIVER

Article 1. Purpose.

The boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam has become indefinite and uncertain because of meanderings in the main channel of the Colorado River with the result that a state of confusion exists as to the true and correct location of the boundary and the enforcement and administration of the laws of the two states have been rendered difficult.

The purpose of this compact is to fix the location of the boundary line between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam.

Article II. Description.

The boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state

line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam is herewith defined as a line passing through a series of fixed points located in the mid-channel of the Colorado River which are tied by bearing and distance to established monuments and described as follows:

Point No. 1, being the place of beginning where the Nevada-California boundary intersects the 35th degree of latitude north; thence northerly 18,099.91 feet along a curve to the right (with a radius bearing North $63^{\circ} 34' 35''$ East, a distance of 13,901.63 feet) to

Point No. 2, which point is North $51^{\circ} 24' 59''$ West 2,769.37 feet from the U.S.C. & G. S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence North $48^{\circ} 10' 31''$ East 1,383.38 feet to

Point No. 3, which point is North $23^{\circ} 05' 44''$ West 2,880.52 feet from the U.S.C. & G. S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence northeasterly 2,625.09 feet along a curve to the right with a radius of 12,170.00 feet to

Point No. 4, which point is North $19^{\circ} 27' 17''$ East 4,294.35 feet from the U.S.C. & G. S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence northerly 10,610.88 feet along a curve to the left with a radius of 5,775.00 feet to

Point No. 5, which is North $9^{\circ} 40' 04''$ East 13,460.60 feet from the U.S.C. & G.S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence North $44^{\circ} 44' 23''$ West 1,364.03 feet to

Point No. 6, which point is North $5^{\circ} 13' 06''$ East 14,297.57 feet from the U.S.C. & G.S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence northwesterly 7,745.77 feet along a curve to the left with a radius of 15,000.00 feet to

Point No. 7, which point is South $74^{\circ} 59' 41''$ West 1,077.76 feet from the southeast corner of Section 24, Township 20 North, Range 23 West, G. & S. R. Base & Meridian in Arizona; thence northwesterly

2,687.16 feet along a curve to the right with a radius of 5,250.00 feet to Point No. 8, which point is North $72^{\circ} 18' 49''$ West 3,334.98 feet from the southeast corner of Section 24, Township 20 North, Range 23 West, G. & S. Article III. Ratification and Effective Date.

This compact shall become operative when it has been
ratified and approved by the legislatures of the States of Arizona
and Nevada and approved by the Congress of the United States.

Dated this 6th day of February, 1900, at Phoenix, Arizona.

Sec. 3. Proclamation by governor

The secretary of state of the state of Arizona shall
transmit a duly certified copy of this act to the governor of the
state of Nevada. The governor of Arizona, whenever officially
advised that the state of Nevada has ratified and approved the
compact set forth in section 2 and whenever the congress of the
United States has approved the compact, shall make proclamation of
that fact. A copy of such proclamation shall be published one time
in a weekly newspaper of general circulation in the county seat of
Mohave county, Arizona.

Sec. 4. Petition to congress

The congress of the United States, as soon as the state
of Nevada has ratified and approved the compact set forth in section
2, is petitioned, pursuant to article I, section 10, clause 3 of the
United States Constitution, to give its consent to the settlement
and location of the above described portion of the common boundary,
as set forth in section 2, between the states of Arizona and
Nevada. The secretary of state of the state of Arizona shall
transmit duly certified copies of this act to the presiding officers
of the senate and house of representatives of the United States and
to the several senators and representatives from the states of
Arizona and Nevada to the congress of the United States, who are

petitioned to take such action as they deem proper to procure the consent of the congress of the United States to this compact between the states of Arizona and Nevada.

Sec. 5. Nonprejudicial effect of act

Nothing contained in the provisions of this act or any operation thereof shall prejudice the titles, rights or claims of any person, public or private, natural or artificial to any of the lands herein involved whether such titles, rights or claims arise or exist upon the basis that the lands affected by the designation of boundary as set forth in the compact and in this act were previously a part of the state of Arizona and have now become a part of the state of Nevada or were previously a part of the state of Nevada and have now become a part of the state of Arizona, or otherwise.

Sec. 6. Duty of county recorder; retroactive effect of recordings

From and after the date of approval by the congress of the United States of the compact set forth in section 2 of this act, the county recorder of Mohave county, Arizona, shall accept and record, without charge therefor, patents, deeds or other evidence of ownership or interest in any lands recorded in Clark county, Nevada, which were previously considered a part of the state of Nevada but are now included within the boundary of the state of Arizona as described in section 2 of this act. Recordings made under the provisions of this section shall have retroactive effect to the date of their original recording in the state of Nevada.

Sec. 7. Emergency

To preserve the public peace, health and safety it is necessary that this act become immediately operative. It is therefore declared to be an emergency measure, to take effect as provided by law.

Giving the consent of Congress to a compact between the State of Arizona and the State of Nevada establishing a boundary between those States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the consent of Congress is hereby given to the compact between the States of Arizona and Nevada as contained in chapter 69, law of the State of Arizona, 1960 (senate bill numbered 203, twenty-fourth legislature assembled, approved by the Governor March 24, 1960), and chapter 119, Nevada Revised Statutes 1960 (senate bill numbered 121, passed by the 1960 legislature of the State of Nevada and approved by the Governor March 9, 1960) establishing a boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California State line intersects the thirty-fifth degree of latitude north and Davis Dam.

JOINT REPORT OF THE COLORADO RIVER BOUNDARY
COMMISSIONS OF THE STATES OF ARIZONA AND NEVADA
TO THE GOVERNORS AND LEGISLATURES OF THE
RESPECTIVE STATES

Pursuant to Chapter 36, laws 1959, ARS, Sec. 41-523, Twenty-Fourth Legislature, State of Arizona, and Chapter 118, Forty-Ninth Session, Nevada Legislature, the Colorado River Boundary Commission of the State of Arizona was empowered to cooperate with the State of Nevada and a Colorado River Boundary Commission of Nevada was formed for the purpose of making a joint investigation, at the joint expense of the two states, to determine the location of the common boundary of the two states on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the thirty-fifth degree of latitude north and Davis Dam. The Commissioners were authorized to hold such hearings and conferences in either of the two states as may be necessary, and to do such other acts and things separately or in cooperation with each other or with the United States as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes as set forth in the respective legislative acts.

The Commissions were further empowered to negotiate a compact between the two states defining the common boundary between the two points mentioned above subject to legislative approval by both states and by the Congress of the United States. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars was appropriated by the legislatures of each state to their respective Commissions for the purpose of carrying out the terms of the respective acts.

The meandering of the Colorado River in the Mohave Valley section has created a situation of uncertainty as to the location of the center of the channel of the river and, hence, of the state line between Arizona and Nevada. Within the past several years the Bureau of Reclamation has constructed or has been and is in the process of construction, a channel from the point where the 35th parallel of latitude north crosses the Colorado River to near the crossing of the Nevada Southern Gas Company pipe line. Upstream from this point a series of groins, or jetties, to extend outward from the Nevada bank of the river will be constructed. These groins, or jetties, will serve to define the Nevada bank of the stream and will confine the stream between the ends of the jetties and the stream bank in Arizona. The center of the resulting channel will be somewhat eastward of the center of the natural channel of the stream. Above the point of influence of the groins to Davis Dam the river flows between stable and well defined banks.

There is need in the enforcement and administration of the laws of the two states for an exact and definite location of the state line in the above described segment of the river and the fixing of this line is the problem which confronted the two commissions.

The two commissions held four formal meetings on June 4, 1959, October 17, 1959, December 4, 1959, and February 6, 1960. In addition to the formal meetings the members of the Commissions and their Engineering and Legal representatives were in constant communication with each other and held several informal meetings during the period. Members of the Commissions, together with other interested persons and representatives of various federal agencies made an on the spot inspection of the segment of the river by boat and appraised the problems involved.

The Commissions were advised by officials of the Bureau of Reclamation that the Bureau had completed channeling the river from the intersection of the Nevada-California state line and the 35th degree of latitude north, approximately half way to the end of the proposed channelization program which will terminate just below the gas line across the river at a point west of Section 30, Township 20 North, Range 22 West, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian. That above the gas line, jetties would be constructed on the west side but there would be no dredging above the gas line. Further, pursuant to a prior request by the Arizona and California Boundary Commissions, the California-Nevada oblique boundary line had been extended to the point where it crossed the 35th parallel and that point was made the center point of the new channel alignment.

The Commissions determined that the boundary line from the 35th parallel north to the vicinity of the gas pipe line bridge should follow as closely as possible the center of the completed and proposed dredged channel of the Bureau of Reclamation. In the area of the rock jetties, the Commissioners determined that the state line would be located at the mid-way point between the ends of the rock jetties on the Nevada side and the present bank of the stream on the

Arizona side. The Commissions agreed that the location of the state line in the section upstream from the vicinity of the rock jetties offered no problem and required only to be defined by fixed points properly referenced to identifiable points in Arizona and Nevada.

From a practical standpoint, it was determined that the proposed boundary line from Davis Dam southward be established as beginning at the point of the brass cap on Davis Dam, thence down the center of the Colorado River to connect with the point of termination of the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation survey and channelization program and to be described by curves and tangents between selected points.

Points 1 through and including 31 were established. Coordinate data for points 1 - 15 inclusive were supplied by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation (except those for points 8 and 9) and these are based on the Arizona State Grid, Western Zone, as established by U.S.C.&G.S. Coordinates for Arizona Sections 13, 24, and 25, T 20 N, R 23 W, and for the S. W. corner of Section 16, T 20 N, R 22 W, G.&S.R. Base & Meridian, were supplied by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation. Ties to points in Sections 1 and 12 were computed from data shown on Township Plat of General Land Office. Coordinates for Nevada Sections 33, 34, and 35, of T 32 S, R 66 E, Mt. Diablo Base & Meridian, were supplied by U. S. Bureau of Reclamation. Ties to points in Sections 25, 24, 13, 12, and 1 were computed by use of data shown on the township plat of General Land Office. All coordinates supplied by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation are based on the Arizona State Grid, Western Zone. Coordinates of Point 31 were established by use of a tie to the Northwest corner of Section 4, T 32 S, R 66 E, Mt. Diablo Base & Meridian in Nevada, as given on the construction map of the Nevada State Highway Department at the center line terminus of the Nevada Highway crossing Davis Dam. By data from the township plat of the General Land Office, Point 31 was referenced by computation to the Northwest corner of Section 1, T 32 S, R 66 E. The line from Point 1 to Point 7 is the center line of a channel dredged by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation.

The central angles of the curves described in the compact are as follows:

- Point 1 to Point 2 - Central angle 74° 35' 56"
- Point 3 to Point 4 - Central angle 12° 21' 32"
- Point 4 to Point 5 - Central angle 105° 16' 32"
- Point 6 to Point 7 - Central angle 29° 35' 12"
- Point 7 to Point 8 - Central angle 56° 51' 20"
- Point 9 to Point 10 - Central angle 84° 35' 46"

Prior to the final meeting of the two Commissions, a proposed compact, proposed State legislation, and the format for a joint report were considered

and approved. The compact was signed and the Commissions of each State agreed to immediately contact their respective representatives in their State Legislatures with respect to enacting appropriate legislation approving and ratifying the compact after which Congressional consent would be sought.

The Commissions are most grateful to all of those who gave of their time and knowledge in assisting in the solution of the common problem and in particular the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation for the valuable data furnished which materially assisted in the drafting of a legal description for the center line of the river.

The two Commissions having completed their work by approving and signing a proposed compact each with the other for their respective states, which if ratified by the Congress of the United States, will specifically define that portion of the boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada from Davis Dam on the Colorado River to a point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the thirty-fifth degree of latitude north; NOW, THEREFORE,

The Colorado River Boundary Commission of Arizona respectfully recommends to the twenty-fourth Legislature, and the Colorado River Boundary Commission of Nevada respectfully recommends to the fiftieth Legislature, that they, and each of them, enact appropriate legislation ratifying the compact, and that the two Commissions, individually and jointly do all things necessary to obtain the consent of the Congress of the United States and that when the consent of the Congress is obtained that the Governor of each State make proclamation of that fact.





February 6, 1960





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INTERSTATE COMPACT DEFINING A PORTION OF THE
ARIZONA-NEVADA BOUNDARY ON THE COLORADO RIVER

Article I. Purpose.

The boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam has become indefinite and uncertain because of meanderings in the main channel of the Colorado River with the result that a state of confusion exists as to the true and correct location of the boundary and the enforcement and administration of the laws of the two states have been rendered difficult.

The purpose of this compact is to fix the location of the boundary line between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam.

Article II. Description.

The boundary between the States of Arizona and Nevada on the Colorado River between the point where the Nevada-California state line intersects the 35th degree of latitude north and Davis Dam is herewith defined as a line passing through a series of fixed points located in the mid-channel of the Colorado River which are tied by bearing and distance to established monuments and described as follows:

Point No. 1, being the place of beginning where the Nevada-California boundary intersects the 35th degree of latitude north; thence northerly 18,099.91 feet along a curve to the right (with a radius bearing North $63^{\circ} 34' 35''$ East, a distance of 13,901.63 feet) to

Point No. 2, which point is North $51^{\circ} 24' 59''$ West 2,769.37 feet from the U.S.C.&G.S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence North $48^{\circ} 10' 31''$ East 1,383.38 feet to

Point No. 3, which point is North $23^{\circ} 05' 44''$ West 2,880.52 feet from the U.S.C.&G.S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence northeasterly 2,625.09 feet along a curve to the right with a radius of 12,170.00 feet to

Point No. 4, which point is North $13^{\circ} 27' 17''$ East 4,294.35 feet from the U.S.C.&G.S. Fort Mohave triangulation station; thence northerly 10,610.88 feet along a curve to the left with a radius of 5,775.00 feet to


Article III. Ratification and Effective Date.
