## CHAINS

The following field notes describe the remonumentation of Angle Point Number 843, on the north boundary of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Township 10 North, Range 16 East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona, as provided for in the Special Instructions dated March 25, 1970, for Group No. 522, Arizona.

The remonumentation of the original corner point was made at the request of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

The mean magnetic declination is  $14^{\circ}$  E.

Re monumenting a Corner established by J.B. Wright,  
in 1906 and remonumented by Wallace R. Ott, in 1966

Angle Point No. 843, determined from the remains of the original cor. tree; a root hole, with a down pine alongside, with scribe marks AP N B MIR 843 on one face, and BM FR on another face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 15 ins. in the ground, supported with a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
