First - Commencing at a monument of stone mentioned in the Notice of Location as marking the center of the North end boundary line which is also the center monument on the South end boundary line of the Hubbard Consolidated Mining Claim established by me and described as a Granite Stone post 4×8 inches $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches long planted $\frac{2}{3}$ in the ground with a monument or mound of stone erected alongside $4 + 4$ feet base $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet high. I mark along the side of this post facing Southward S. G. No. 16. for Linc Yunker, Number one.

Using a Burts Solar Compass and referring exclusively to the Solar attachment on account of the unreliability of the magnetite needle because of local mineral attraction I took the following observations:-


