The Survey has been executed with
a Keller and Brightley Transit
(Philadelphia made)

I determined the true meridian
by equal shadows of the sun, making
my observations at the time of the
Summer Solstice June 21st 1883, and
obtained fourteen (14) degrees and
twenty five (25) minutes east as
the variation.

The Mariposa mine having been
located prior to May 10th 1872 and the
certified copy of the location notice
of said mine being not sufficiently
definite and certain to enable me
to make a correct survey therefrom,
I served notice in writing on
J. P. Layne an owner of the mining
ground adjacent to the Mariposa
mine and having ascertained by
his testimony the boundaries as
originally established, I made
the survey in accordance therewith
and with the local laws in force
at the time of location of said
Mariposa mine allowing one
hundred and fifty (150) feet on each
side of centre of vein.

The notice as also the affidavit
accompany these returns.

The improvements on said Mar-
iposa mine consist of a shaft thirty
three (33) feet deep, a shaft twenty
(20) feet deep and a tunnel one
hundred and thirty (130) feet long more or

less. All of said improvements are worth the sum of five hundred (\$500.) dollars and upwards, and have been made by the applicant and their grantors.


