I beg to advise you that on November 21, 1910, the Honorable Commissioner of the General Land Office directed me to ascertain and report the location of mineral entry 07444 of the Golden Eagle and River Bend Lode Claims, Survey No. 2664, made by you as U. S. Mineral Surveyor, with reference to an area included within a townsite (properly "powersite") withdrawal of several years ago.

On January 5, 1911, I advised the Commissioner that from the records of this office or other procurable data it was impossible to definitely locate these claims, and I suggested that you be instructed to chain up the Santa Maria River from its junction with the Big Sandy in order to ascertain this information. 
