## COMMON IMPROVEMENTS.

That the Giant, Centennial, Copper Head, Wedge, Marble Peak and Major Mc Kinley Lodes are situated topographically above the improvements made upon the Blizzard Lode that have been allotted to these claims, This work consists of tunnels and crosscuts, and every foot of advance in these tunnels and crosscuts gains depth on the ore-bearing formations and thus tends to develop all the ground situated above.
