Training Session Information

This annual safety training week is sponsored by the Oregon State BLM Safety Office. All agency employees and members of the public are invited to attend any of the sessions.

- Employees must hold a valid 1st Aid card to attend the **Adult CPR/AED Recertification** training scheduled for Monday afternoon. First aid cards are valid for 3 years. CPR/AED recertification is required each year.
- *A full session for 1st Aid/CPR/AED is scheduled for Wednesday, February 6.*
- This one-day course features basic emergency care including Standard First Aid and Adult/Child CPR, inclusive of AED training. Course includes instruction and hands-on experience with emergency scene management, patient assessment, personal protection, basic life support, cardiology, airway management, wound care, sudden illness care, musko-skeletal issues, environmental emergencies and patient transport.

All agency employees are encouraged to become 1st Aid/CPR/AED trained.

- **Defensive Driver Training** (*Positive Driving*) is required of all agency employees, contractors, and volunteers who drive government vehicles. (*Initial training should be completed upon hire; and, a refresher course completed each 3 years.*) This is a 4-hour behavior based classroom program specifically designed to remind all drivers of the basics of defensive driving as well as how to reduce risk exposure regardless of the type of vehicle. Each participant will receive a wallet size certificate.
- **Disaster Preparedness** – The Pacific Northwest is not immune to natural disasters such as earthquakes or pandemics or to man-made events such as a terrorism incident. This course will explore the possible events facing the Northwest from earthquakes to bird flu. The instruction will include an overview of local, state, and federal emergency management plans and what can be expected following a disaster. The course will conclude with a thorough examination of personal, household, and workplace disaster kits as well as planning and mitigation efforts. Participants receive a training handbook and disaster preparedness certification card good for 3 years.
- **First Responder Awareness & Operations Refresher Training** – OSHA regulations require initial 8-hour training for employees who need to know how to recognize a potential emergency or the potential need for emergency response. ***Annual refresher training*** is required to maintain certification. Field-going employees are encouraged to attend this refresher class, regardless of occupation.
- The **Epinephrine Administration** training is provided for field employees [and others] who may need to administer, or assist others in administering, the drug epinephrine [EPI] during an anaphylactic emergency. ***This class and an addition EPI class scheduled for February 14th will be held at the Salem District Office.***

Anaphylactic shock is defined as a sudden, severe allergic reaction that occurs when someone is exposed to a substance that the body was sensitized to during a previous exposure. The most severe form of anaphylaxis is fatal if not treated immediately. If administered in time, an injection of epinephrine [adrenaline] may reverse the condition and save a life.
