## NORTH SPIT DOCKS INSTALLED

NORTH BEND, Ore. – The docks at the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) boat ramp on the North Spit were installed on March 8 and are now available for public use. The docks are removed from the bay each fall to prevent them from being damaged by winter storms.
