BLM Roads Close for Bridge Paving

NORTH BEND, Ore. – Sections of Bureau of Land Management (BLM) forest roads will close during the weeks of May 11 and May 18, 2009 while bridge approaches are paved.

Road numbers and closure dates for bridges east of **Reedsport, Ore.** are as follows:

- Rd #20-8-22 (Jeff Creek) – Closed May 13
- Rd #20-8-13.0 (Bum Creek) – Closed May 13
- Rd #19-8-31.0 (Upper West Fork Smith River) – Closed May 14 and May 15
- Rd #20-9-33.0 MP 1.0 (Vincent Creek) – Closed May 14 and May 15

Road numbers and closure dates for bridges east of **Coquille, Ore.** are as follows:

- Rd #28-8-18.2 (Scare Ridge) – Closed May 13
- Rd #27-11-27.0 (Cherry Creek) – Closed May 18
- Rd #28-10-12 MP 5.8 (Camas Creek) – Closed May 19
- Rd #28-11-29A (Elk Creek Road) – Closed May 20
