TIMBER SALE NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bureau of Land Management will offer for sale timber as described herein for oral auction, pursuant to Instructions to Bidders, as stated on Form No. 5440-9, attached. Written and oral bids will be received by the District Manager, or her representative, at the **NORTHWEST OREGON DISTRICT**, **SPRINGFIELD INTERAGENCY OFFICE**, **3106 PIERCE PARKWAY**, **SPRINGFIELD**, **OREGON**. The timber sale will commence at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, **June 22**, **2017**.

This Timber Sale Notice does <u>not</u> constitute the decision document for purposes of protest and appeal of a forest management decision. Consistent with 43 CFR Subpart 5003 - Administrative Remedies, the notice of a timber sale, when published as a legal ad in a newspaper of general circulation shall constitute the decision document for purposes of protest and appeal. Protests may be filed with the Contracting Officer within 15 days of the publication of the aforementioned decision document in the newspaper. It is anticipated that the decision document will be published in <u>The Register-Guard</u> newspaper on or about <u>May 24, 2017</u>. BLM does not warrant publication on this exact date. All parties considering protest of the timber sale decision document are encouraged to review the aforementioned newspaper to ensure accurate knowledge of the exact publication date.

A WRITTEN BID on Form 5440-9 at not less than the appraised price on a unit basis per species and the required minimum bid deposit shall be required to participate in oral bidding for each tract.

THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER, as a condition of award, will be required to complete and/or sign the following forms:

- 1. Form 5430-11, a certification that the bid was arrived at by the bidder or offerer independently, and was tendered without collusion with any other bidder or offerer.
- 2. Form 5450-17, Export Determination.

PRE-AWARD QUALIFICATIONS. The high bidder may be required to furnish information to determine the ability to perform the obligations of the contract. If the high bidder is determined not qualified, not responsible or refuses to respond within 15 days of a request for information pertaining to qualifications, the contract may be offered and awarded for the amount of the high bid to the highest of the bidders who is qualified, responsible, and willing to accept the contract.

A PERFORMANCE BOND in an amount not less than 20 percent of the total purchase price will be required for all contracts of \$2,500 or more, but the amount of the bond shall not be in excess of \$500,000, except when the Purchaser opts to increase the minimum bond as provided in 43 CFR 5451.2. A minimum performance bond of not less than \$500 will be required for all installment contracts less than \$2,500.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS may be authorized for sales of \$500 or more. Required installments will be determined by BLM. For sales under \$500,000, installments will not be less than 10% of the total purchase price. For sales of \$500,000 or more, installment payments shall be \$50,000.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION. All timber sales, including timber from Federal rights-of-ways, shall be subject to the restrictions relating to the export and substitution of unprocessed timber from the United States in accordance with P.L. 94-165 and 43 CFR 5400 and 5424, as amended.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION RESTRICTIONS. Excepting Port-Orford-cedar, all timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

The BLM has revised the log export restrictions special provision to reduce the log branding and painting requirements. The new requirements include branding of one end of all logs with a scaling diameter of over 10 inches. All loads of 11 logs or more, regardless of the diameter of the logs, will have a minimum of 10 logs branded on one end. All logs will be branded on loads of 10 logs or less. One end of all branded logs will be marked with yellow paint. At the discretion of the Contracting Officer, the Purchaser may be required to brand and paint all logs. The Purchaser shall bear any increased costs for log branding and painting.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION concerning each timber sale tract described herein is available at the above District Office. A copy of the timber sale contract is also available for inspection at the District Office. This prospectus includes maps and tables that cannot be made Section 508 compliant. For help with its data or information, please contact the Northwest Oregon District, Springfield Interagency Office at (541) 683-6798.

THE VOLUMES LISTED herein are estimates only, based on 16-foot taper breaks, which must be taken into consideration if comparisons are made with volume predictions based on other standards. The volumes based on 32-foot taper breaks are shown for comparison purposes. No sale shall be made for less than the total purchase price, without regard to the amount bid per unit, even though quantity of timber actually cut or removed or designated for taking is more or less than the estimated volume or quantity so listed.

AN ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT was prepared for the Mid Indian timber sale, and a Finding of No Significant Impact has been documented. These documents are available for inspection, as background for this sale, at the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS (EAs) were prepared for the Long Tom Landscape Plan Project, which includes the Cedar Rose and Double Cross timber sale areas. A Finding of No Significant Impact and Decision Record for these EAs have been documented. A Determination of NEPA Adequacy (DNA) has been documented for each of these sales. These documents are available for inspection, as background for these sales, at the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office.

<u>APPRAISED PRICES</u> are calculated by determining market value through the analytical appraisal method. The minimum bid increment will be \$0.10 per MBF or multiples thereof.

<u>LOG EXPORT RESTRICTIONS</u>: All timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

<u>NOTE</u>: The volume for this timber sale has been calculated using 16 foot eastside Scribner rules, and the 32 foot log volumes are estimates derived from the 16 foot volumes.

<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: Volume for all species has been cruised using the 3P system to select sample trees. A portion of the sample trees have been cruised and the volume computed using the *National Cruise Processing Program* for estimating volume in 16-foot lengths and the volume expanded to a total sale volume. A map showing the location of the sample trees is available at the Springfield Interagency Office.

With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir (sample) trees: The average tree is 15.5" DBHOB; the average log contains 63 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 807 MBF; and 97% recovery is expected.

<u>DURATION OF CONTRACT</u>: Duration of the contract will be 24 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, road renovation, road maintenance, road decommissioning, logging methods, prevention of erosion, falling of snags, falling of all trees designated for cutting, logging residue reduction, and submission of a written logging plan specifying landing locations, spur road locations, logging methods and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 26 of the timber sale contract, ground based logging will be prohibited during periods of excessive soil moisture. This will normally limit ground based logging to July, August, and September.

It is estimated that 117 MBF of additional timber, such as corridor and guyline trees may be removed under the contract, but it is not included in the advertised sale volume, nor is it included in the timber sale appraisal.

A Special Provision has been added that expands on safety and temporary traffic control measures required under the contract.

A revised Special Provision has been added to the contract which enables the Contracting Officer to suspend the contract to facilitate protection of certain plant or animal species, and/or to modify or terminate the contract when necessary to: (1) Comply with the Endangered Species Act or to prevent incidental take of northern spotted owls in accordance with management direction in the Record of Decision (ROD) and Resource Management Plan (RMP), or; (2) Comply with a court order, or; (3) Protect species which were identified for protection through survey and manage and/or protection buffer standards and guidelines or management direction established in the ROD and RMP.

OTHER SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:


- Yarding shall be done with a carriage equipped skyline capable of yarding 1,600 feet slope distance in the Partial Harvest Area on slopes greater than 35%.
- Approximately 11 trees marked with yellow paint above and below breast height in the Approximate Location of Special Habitat Trees shown on Exhibit A shall not be felled or damaged during logging operations.
- In the Special Tailhold/Guyline Area, approval from the Authorized Officer shall be obtained prior to attaching logging equipment to any tree.
- The Purchaser shall have the option to rock Spurs A and B for wet weather haul. Additional requirements for wet weather haul include the addition of cross drains, stream culverts, and rocking. All wet weather haul related work is at the Purchaser's expense.

- Upon completion of haul, all decommissioning shall be completed during the dry season and as directed by the Authorized Officer. Decommissioning measures include:
 - Decompact skid trails and natural surfaced roads with decompaction equipment, such as a track mounted excavator.
 - Construct drainage dips, waterbars, and/or lead-off ditches.
 - Place logging slash greater than 6 inches in diameter, where available, on surfaces in a discontinuous pattern, as directed by the Authorized Officer.
 - o Block entry points using root wads, logs, and/or slash.
- The Exhibit F contains explicit instruction on requirements for equipment and personnel involved in pile burning.

Optional Contributions: The Purchaser will have the option of performing pile burning or contributing \$425.73 in lieu thereof. The option must be declared prior to contract execution. Piling and covering are not included in the Optional Contribution and will remain the responsibility of the Purchaser.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF HOW TO GET TO THE TIMBER SALE AREA: Access to the sale is through locked gates. 





<u>APPRAISED PRICES</u> are calculated by determining market value through the analytical appraisal method. The minimum bid increment will be \$0.10 per MBF or multiples thereof.

<u>LOG EXPORT RESTRICTIONS</u>: All timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

<u>NOTE</u>: The volume for this timber sale has been calculated using 16 foot eastside Scribner rules, and the 32 foot log volumes are estimates derived from the 16 foot volumes.

<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: Volume for all Douglas-fir, western hemlock and western redcedar in the Partial Harvest Area was variable plot cruised. Plot data is then used to calculate v-bar and basal area per acre using the National Cruise Processing Program. The basal area was determined with a Relaskop using a 20 BAF. This sale contains a total of 254 plots. 98 sample trees were randomly selected on these plots to determine v-bar. A map showing the location of the sample trees is available at the Northwest Oregon Springfield Interagency Office.

All Douglas-fir in the right-of-ways have been cruised using the 3P system to select sample trees. The sample trees have been cruised and the volume computed using the National Cruise Processing Program for estimating volume in 16 foot lengths and the volume expanded to a total right-of-way volume. A map showing the location and description of these sample trees is available at the Northwest Oregon Springfield Interagency Office. The timber volumes for bigleaf maple and red alder in the right-of-ways were based on a 100% cruise using the National Cruise Processing Program for estimating board foot volume of trees in 16 foot logs.

With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir (sample) trees: The average tree is 18.0" DBHOB; the average log contains 89 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 10,056 MBF; and 95% recovery is expected.

<u>CUTTING AREA</u>: One cutting area totaling approximately 315 acres must be partial harvested and 7 acres of right-of-way must be clear cut.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is provided by:

- 2. BLM existing roads;

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, renovation, improvement, and maintenance, logging methods, prevention of erosion, falling of snags, falling of all trees designated for cutting, logging residue reduction, and submission of a written logging plan specifying spur road locations, landing locations, logging methods, and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 26 of the timber sale contract, tractor logging will be prohibited during periods of excessive soil moisture. This will normally limit tractor logging to July, August, and September.

It is estimated that approximately 1,284 MBF of additional timber, such as corridor and guyline trees, may be removed under the contract, but it is not included in the advertised sale volume, nor is it included in the timber sale appraisal.

A Special Provision has been added that expands on safety and temporary traffic control measures required under the contract.

A revised Special Provision has been added to the contract which enables the Contracting Officer to suspend the contract to facilitate protection of certain plant or animal species, and/or to modify or terminate the contract when necessary to: (1) Comply with the Endangered Species Act or to prevent incidental take of northern spotted owls in accordance with management direction in the Record of Decision (ROD) and Resource Management Plan (RMP), or; (2) Comply with a court order, or; (3) Protect species which were identified for protection through survey and manage and/or protection buffer standards and guidelines or management direction established in the ROD and RMP.



- Yarding shall be done with a carriage equipped skyline capable of yarding 1,700 feet slope distance in the Partial Harvest Area on slopes greater than 35%.
- In the Special Yarding Areas, logs may be yarded through the Reserve Area.
- 138 trees marked with yellow paint above and below breast height shall not be felled or damaged during logging operations.
- During the use of Road No. 18-6-5, the road shall not be blocked for more than 20 minutes at a time during operations. At the close of business each day the road shall be cleared.
- The Purchaser shall rock Spurs 1-5 and 7, and Road Nos. 18-6-4.1, 18-6-5, 18-6-5.5, and 18-6-5.6 for wet weather haul.
- The Purchaser shall determine the location of Spur 5. The final spur road location, landings, and clearing limits shall be identified with flagging and shall be approved by the Authorized Officer in writing before construction begins. The Purchaser agrees to accept a modification to the contract for the additional timber within the right-of-way.
- The construction of Road No. 18-6-4.1 and the renovation of Road No. 18-6-5.5 require the purchase of approximately 1 MBF of private timber.
- Upon completion of hauling, all decommissioning shall be completed during the dry season and as directed by the Authorized Officer. Decommissioning measures may include:
 - Decompact skid trails and natural surfaced roads with decompaction equipment, such as a track mounted excavator.
 - o Construct drainage dips, waterbars, and/or lead-off ditches.

 - Block at entry points using stumps, slash, and/or cull logs, as directed by the Authorized Officer.

<u>OPTIONAL CONTRIBUTION</u>: The Purchaser will have the option of performing pile burning or contributing \$3,609.45 in lieu thereof. The option must be declared prior to contract execution. Piling and covering are not included in the Optional Contribution and will remain the responsibility of the Purchaser.



<u>DURATION OF CONTRACT</u>: Duration of the contract will be 36 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, road renovation, road improvement, road maintenance, gate fabrication and installation, logging methods, prevention of erosion, logging residue reduction, and submission of a written logging plan specifying landing locations and logging schedule.


